ONCOFERTILITY & FERTILITY PRESERVATION



The importance of understanding your options for family planning as it pertains to health issues that affect fertility and are unique to those with ovaries. What is oncofertility? Oncofertility is the process of preserving fertility prior to medical treatments, such as chemotherapy or radiation, that could potentially harm your reproductive system or your current fertility level.

Who should consider fertility preservation?

Individuals receiving treatment that could harm their current fertility level, those who have been diagnosed with ovarian cancer, those who have tested positive for BRCA1, BRCA2, or Lynch Syndrome, and those with conditions such as PCOS and Endometriosis which can increase the lifetime risk of ovarian cancer should consider fertility preservation.

Is oncofertility safe?

RMA of New York's dedicated team will work closely with you and your oncologist to ensure your safety is the top priority, navigate your care, and tailor your fertility preservation intervention accordingly. T.E.A.L.[®] and RMA collaboratively recognize and acknowledge the critical importance of providing comprehensive fertility preservation options for individuals facing diverse reproductive health challenges, particularly ovarian cancer patients and survivors, those genetically predisposed to ovarian cancer (BRCA and Lynch Syndrome+) and those with polycystic ovary syndrome (PCOS), endometriosis, and other conditions unique to women. It is understood that these individuals often encounter complex and emotionally demanding journeys. Preserving and accessing fertility preservation options can significantly impact their quality of life, future aspirations, and family-building choices.

For women diagnosed with ovarian cancer, preserving fertility is of paramount significance. It is recognized that cancer treatments such as chemotherapy, radiation therapy, and surgery can have adverse effects on fertility. Therefore, T.E.A.L.® and RMA of New York are committed to raising awareness, supporting research, and collaborating with medical professionals to ensure that appropriate fertility preservation options are made available, discussed, and accessible to ovarian cancer patients.

How much will it cost?

If you choose to pursue fertility treatment at RMA of New York, you will receive a dedicated financial advisor who will be able to assist in the payment process. If you have fertility benefits through your insurance, they will work closely with your provider. Additionally, RMA of New York offers a 25% discount to oncofertility patients on procedures and will connect you with their partners for grants, discounted rates, and medication coverage.

Are there options for someone who has already undergone cancer treatment?

Yes. There are family-building options for patients who have already undergone treatment. You can schedule an appointment with one of RMA of New York's Reproductive Endocrinologists to learn about your options.

What is the timeline of the process?

Pending your treatment start date, you will meet with members of RMA of New York's clinical team within 48-hours of your initial call to discuss the logistics of your treatment. While every patient's protocol is unique and personalized to them, the fertility preservation process will take about 10-12 days total.
